Statement of Christian Faith

Macarthur Anglican School holds to the tenants and beliefs of the Anglican Church in the Diocese of Sydney. As such, all employees are expected to either hold to these same tenets and beliefs or commit to support them in word and deed.

The School believes and holds to the truth of the Christian faith as set forth in the Apostles' Creed below.

Apostles Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth;
and in Jesus Christ, his only Son our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, dead, and buried.
He descended into hell.
The third day he rose again from the dead
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty;
from there he shall come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit;

the holy catholic church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Further to this the School believes:

- there is only one way to God which is through his Son, Jesus Christ, who died for us the death that everyone deserves; and,
- that God's word, the Bible, is the one final authority in all matters of faith and conduct.

Employee expectations

All employees of the School must acknowledge and understand that the School aims to educate young people in ways consistent with the teaching of the Bible and the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to this end support the School's commitment to maintain and uphold the Christian faith in teaching and practice.

All staff must agree that their ongoing employment at the School is dependent upon their continuing acknowledgment and understanding of this statement of faith and undertake to resign if this ceases to be the case.
