Zero (0) Year 11 students left Macarthur in 2023 before completing their HSC. 3 students left at the end of Year 10. 1 student left during the course of their Year 12 studies.

The 2023 Year 10 leavers fell into several groups as determined by information provided to the School by students and their families upon leaving. These destinations are outlined in the table below. Percentages are shown for the 2023 cohort, with the percentages for the past five years' cohorts in the adjacent columns for comparison.

These figures show that in 2023, the main reason for students leaving was to attend other schools outside the Macarthur area and students wanting to attend TAFE or training.

Students Completing the HSC

A total of 108 students completed their senior secondary education at Macarthur in 2023, with 99.07% of the group successfully awarded the Higher School Certificate. In addition to this, one student was awarded their HSC Life Skills Certificate.

Post-School Pathways

107 of the 108 Year 12 students applied for an ATAR.

Of these, 95% of students received university offers, and 87% received an early-round offer.

Other university offers included 30% at the University of Sydney, 32% at the University of Technology Sydney, 19% at the University of Wollongong, 26% at the University of New South Wales, 24% at Western Sydney University, 7% at the University of Western Australia, and 10% at other institutions.

Tertiary Courses

These students are now pursuing a diverse range of courses, including (but not limited to) Health Sciences, Medicine, Engineering, Business, Law, Psychology, Information Technology, Architecture, Veterinary Science, Economics and Commerce, Media and Communications, Agriculture, Education and Teaching, Political Science, International Relations, Pharmaceutical Science, Nursing, Aviation, Visual Arts, and Graphic Design.

A small percentage of Year 12 students who completed their HSC are entering the workforce (3%). This is a little less than in previous years.
